

LOGLINE

An adventure through the desert and the manuscript libraries of Mauritania, where one discovers that the person you thought you were may change forever.



SYNOPSIS



What if one day your best friend called you to say that not only are you Sahrawi, but you also have Mauritanian roots and, moreover, you are a descendant of a famous 19th-century Bedouin poet-warrior, Kefia Uld Buseif, a true desert legend?



It might seem like an improbable tale, but it is a true story. That of Suilma Aali and Bahía Awad—two friends living in Madrid, she a singer-songwriter, he a poet and anthropologist—who, after uncovering an ancestral bond, set out together on a journey to the heart of the Mauritanian desert and its legendary libraries, in search of answers.


Along the way, revelations emerge, stemming both from centuries-old manuscripts and the living memory of the people who inhabit this ancestral landscape. This is how *The Dune of Chinguetti* is born —a documentary built in real-time, allowing emotions to guide the narrative.






In *The Dune of Chinguetti*, the protagonists discover that identity is not a fixed destination, but a journey that can be transformed forever when touched by the secrets of the past.

EBBA EMMAD ULD ELBAH. Muezzin of the Chinguetti mosque.
























In 2022, Jerónimo Carrillo Acosta and José Manuel Almeida, creators of the original idea and lovers of lost causes, decided to travel across Mauritania in an old Land Rover with a humanitarian project in the north of the country. This journey opened their eyes to a world completely unknown to them, and they decided this story had to be told.



«The Dune of Chinguetti was born from an unexpected phone call and a question that changed everything: Who are we when we look toward our roots? This film emerges from a gesture of trust, from a journey to the heart of the Mauritanian desert in search of identity and shared memory. As co-directors, we wanted to film without interrupting —letting the camera listen, and the landscape speak as much as the people. We embraced an intimate, sensory style, guided by emotion. This documentary is also an exercise in listening —a living process that transforms its protagonists… and those who film».



Eduardo Peralta Martín






SECOND CAMERA




MLK PRODUCTIONS




